COMMITTEE WORK

Financial Committee May Meeting – COLA Increase: The financial committee consisting of Jan Poulter, Harry Ruth, Mark Peter met in May to discuss the rising cost of living and its effect on staff. Discussed the current inflation rate and how it is affecting staff and the need to do something to help current employees. Retention effects were also discussed. Proposed providing a mid-year adjustment to staff to help offset current inflation rates. Motion was made Richard wright, seconded by Mark Peter to provide a one-time mid-year payment to offset the current inflation rate to be paid as a lump sum at 7.5% of annual gross wages (prorated to hire date) to be paid separate of payroll in August.
