The County Board of Adams County, Illinois met at the Courthouse, Quincy, Illinois, on Tuesday, February 14th, 2023 at 7:00 P.M., pursuant to recess.

Mr. Mark Sorensen gave the invocation which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

Chairman Snider called the meeting to order.

Transportation, Building & Technology

Committee Report (Mr. Bellis)

Bills – The committee met on Tuesday, February 14th to review the bills for the Highway Department, the Maintenance Department, and the Technology Department. All of the bills were in order.

Reports

The Highway Department reported on various projects to the committee. They are working with the Sheriff's Department to work on a solution from the attempted jail escape. They have a plan in motion.

Mr. Callaway entered the meeting at 7:07 PM

Resolutions

- a. 2023-02-501-004 – Resolution for the improvement of a 2.216-mile portion of County Highway 11 north of Camp Point, the appropriation of matching funds of \$165,000.00 or as much as may be needed to complete the proposed improvement from the County's Matching Tax Fund and authorizing the Adams County Board Chairman to sign the agreement with IDOT. Mr. Zanger made a motion to approve the resolution.

Mr. Post seconded the motion.

- d. 2023-02-501-007 - Resolution for approval of a Plat of Stony Creek Subdivision, located in Section 12 of Riverside Township, subject to approval of the County Engineer's subdivision checklist (Attachment A-4)

The clerk read the resolution by title only.

Mr. Zanger made a motion to approve the resolution.

Mr. Bellis seconded the motion.

Resolution 2023-02-501-007 was approved.

New Business

- a. Review and Approval of Mold Remediation / Duct Cleaning Bids for the Adams County Courthouse

Mr. Bellis reported that the committee received two separate bids for the mold issue. He stated the committee approved Safestart Environmental's Option 2 for \$56,000. He stated they can add a correction plan for another \$20,500. Mr. Bellis stated the committee recommends Safestart Environmental to do the work. He stated they are two months out so they want to get our name on their books.

Mr. Hinkamper stated it would be mid-April before they do the testing and take 2 weeks post-testing to get a report. Mr. Cooley asked the difference of the three options. Mr. Bellis stated the first was 2 different sets of 40 traps for \$47,500 with travel and expenses included and get a report of their findings. . The second one was what we picked and it is 44 traps, 20 tape lift swabs and 80 fungal, travel and expenses, and report of findings for \$56,000. The third was everything mentioned with remediation recommendations was 56,000. Mr. Zanger stated that the second one included swabs and extra things as well as identifying the problem areas. Mr. McCleary stated between two and three, they would state what would need to be done to remedy the situation. He stated that it is completely different testing than the Fungus-A-Mungus. Mr. Callaway asked the square footage of the area that needs repaired. The committee responded that we do not know until it gets tested. Mr. Bellis stated the company recommended testing first before cleaning the ducts. Mr. McCleary stated that if you clean the ducts before testing, it could re-infect the ducts after the fact and they would need cleaned twice and the cleaning of the ducts may be part of the remediation process.

Mr. McQueen stated that there needs to be a standard. Mr. Hinkamper stated that every company is a little different and there is no standard and little regulations. Mr. Zanger stated there is no licensing for this type of work.

Mr. Bellis made a motion to accept Option 2 from Safestart Environmental as well as including language in the contract stating the testing company only talks to Mr. Snider, Mr. Bellis and Terry Bower and not speak to employees.

Mr. McQueen asked what more we are getting with this company than from Fungus-A-Mungus. Mr. Post stated we are getting more testing. Mr. Hinkamper stated this is more granular testing.

Mr. Callaway seconded the motion.
The motion was approved.

The committee's next meeting is scheduled for March 14th, 2023.

Legislative & Judicial

Committee Report (Mr. Reich)

Bills – The committee met on February 14th, 2023 to review the bills from the circuit Clerk, Juvenile Detention Center, Probation Department, Public Defender, State's Attorney, and the Supervisor of Assessments. All of the bills were in order.

Reports

Mr. Reich stated that the wind and solar regulations are done through the state and any county regulations are null and void. The committee had a speaker from ES&S to present some new ADA Equipment for elections. He stated they are also working on a Plat Act to get better descriptions for splits and consolidations of properties during recording. He reported they will hopefully have more progress on that in the next 2 months.

Public Health & Safety

Committee Report (Mrs. Fletcher)

Bills – The committee met on February 14th, 2023 and reviewed the bills for the Sheriff's Office, Coroner's Office, Emergency Management Agency and Animal Control. All of the bills were in order.

Reports-

Kaylee Gilbert spoke to the committee about the increase suicide risk of sexual assault victims and is requesting the Health Department put more info out. She is also advocating for more cooperation between the Health Department and Quanada to get this information out.

Sheriff Grootens reported to the committee that he has been in contact with US Marshall service. They inspected the jail and it looks like the county will begin housing federal inmates in the near future. Once this is approved by D.C., it would start out at \$75 per day, per inmate and could raise to \$95 per day, per inmate depending on the medical needs of the inmate. There is a 30 prisoner capability projector for our jail. Adams County will be responsible for transportation of the inmates to and from federal court. They are looking at ideas getting that to work such as hiring retired law enforcement to do the transports. The transportation fees will be paid for by the federal government as part of the program. They spoke about cameras in the squad cars. There are some bad and some cars that have none at all. The Sheriff is looking at getting a proposal. The holdup is that the cameras are going to have to be compatible with whatever they choose for body cameras. Mr. Austin stated that a 3rd party vendor came in and went over this. He stated there should be information in the Sheriff's logs or maybe have them come back to talk to them again.

Director Simon reported that the national weather storm spotter course will return on March 6th. An EMT class will be graduating, and they expect to get 2 full time and some part time people from that class. The Quincy High class is going very well. They intend to do a full-year class instead of just a semester next year. They are also working on their ambulance camera issues.

Coroner Scott Graham reported 94 deaths, 6 autopsies, 0 abandon cremains, 51 cremation permits issued and 1 suicide in the month of January.

They received a letter from the State regarding noxious weed abatement and they will discuss that next month in the Executive meeting.

Committee Report (Mr. Austin)

The committee met on February 6th, 2023.

Reports

Resolution-

- a. Resolution Number 2023-02-431-006 – ARPA: Upgrade to the Information Technology of the Adams County Courtrooms Change Order (New Circuits) in the Amount of \$4,557 (Attachment C-1)

The clerk read the resolution by title only.

Mr. Austin made a motion to approve the resolution.

Mr. Finlay seconded the motion.

Discussion: Mr. Austin stated they did this in March 2022. He stated they missed a wiring issue in the bid for the courtroom technology. The contractor was already here working, so they are doing this as a change-order as most of the work is already completed. He stated there is enough money in ARPA to cover this.

A roll call vote was taken to approve the resolution. Discussion and Possible Action

- a. Collective Bargaining Agreement between Adams County Highway and General Teamsters (12/01/2022 – 11/30/2025).

Mr. Austin stated that this is retroactive. He stated they have everything agreed to and it is ready to approve. There have been no changes since the last time it was discussed.

Mr. Austin made a motion to ratify the contract.

Mr. Bellis seconded the motion.

The contract was approved.

- b. Memorandum of Understanding with PBPA and the Adams County Sheriff Corrections -- Shift Leads

Mr. Austin made a motion to approve the MOU.

Mr. Callaway seconded the motion.

Mr. Austin asked the Sheriff for explanation. The Sheriff stated that it will add a supervisory position for very little money. They can always have a supervisor in the corrections area of the jail. He stated it is a \$1.35 an hour raise and gives them a shot for advancement. He stated they need 11 and will also get controllers in the control room to get the CO's out of there and work the floor. It will increase the coverage as well. Mr. Austin stated that this will give them more flexibility. The Sheriff agreed.

The MOU was approved.

- c. Memorandum of Understanding with PBPA and the Adams County Sheriff Corrections – Extensions Until the End of Contract
Mr. Austin made a motion to approve the MOU.
Mr. Bellis seconded the motion.
Mr. Austin asked the Sheriff to explain this MOU. Sheriff Grootens asked if this was about the ankle monitors. Mr. Austin responded that it was. The Sheriff stated there are inmates that go on work release. With ankle-monitors they are required to go home right after work and it is monitored 24-7. Sheriff stated this is a good thing and says some of the people on work-release need a structured environment and won't qualify for this but it will work for others. He stated they charge for the ankle monitor, too.
- d. Intergovernmental Agreement between the County of Adams and the City of Quincy for a Land Lease for Vermont Street Parking. (Attachment C-2)
Mr. Austin made a motion to approve the agreement.
Mr. Reich seconded the motion.
Mr. Austin explained the overview of the plan. He stated the engineering is done and paid for. He reported it will widen the parking lot. He stated they have talked to Ameren and Adams Fiber to move their utilities at no cost. The city will cover their portion of moving a fire hydrant and a tree. The city is going to reconstruct the alley all the way to 5th street at their cost. He reported the estimate is \$313,000 total. It has to go out to bid and they've already paid \$10,000 of it in engineering. They currently have \$327,000 in the economic development Tif account. It will be a county-owned and maintained parking lot. It will be open to the public but the hope is to open more parking for employees. Mr. Bellis stated that their committee unanimously approved moving forward with this project. Mr. Austin stated it could be the spring of 2024 before this project is completed.
The agreement was approved.

Mr. Austin stated that they are working on an updated ARPA project sheet.

The committee's next meeting will be March 6th, 2023.

Finance

Committee Report (Mr. Austin)

Bills – The committee met on February 13th, 2023 to review the bills. All of the bills were in order.

Report-

There were no extra reports. The committee did discuss the OPIOD settlement. Mr. Austin reported they have received \$52,000 at this point. The Chairman has signed 2 other settlement agreements as well. He stated it looks as the county will receive between \$300-400,000 a year, for 10 years. He stated the state has said they will authorize a list of uses for this money.

- a. Additional Fund Appropriation from F. Resolution for Improvement by County Under the Illinois Highway Code

TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY BOARD

Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, the County of Adams, Illinois is proposing to improve County Highway 11 (East 2300th Street), beginning north of the intersection with North 2100th Ave and extending northerly to SN 001-3303 (South Fork of Bear Creek bridge), for a distance of 2.216 miles. The type of improvement to be milling and resurfacing with 2" Polymerized HMA Surface Course, along with incidental HMA, aggregate shoulders, pavement markings and other ancillary work. The improvement shall be designated Section 19-00017-06-FP, State Job No. C-96-054-21 and Project No. HE8U(578).

WHEREAS, the above stated improvement will necessitate the use of funding provided through the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the signee; and

WHEREAS, the use of these funds requires a joint funding agreement (AGREEMENT) with IDOT; and

WHEREAS, the improvement requires matching funds; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Adams County Board:



This agreement is made and entered by and between the COUNTY OF ADAMS of the State of Illinois, hereinafter called the COUNTY and the CITY OF QUINCY of the State of Illinois, hereinafter called the CITY, effective on the last date signed by a party hereto.

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq. enables the parties to enter into agreements among themselves and provide authority for intergovernmental cooperation; and

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the COUNTY in order to increase available parking for employees at the county courthouse, is desirous of improving and enlarging the existing parking lot located on Parcel 23-1-0155-000-00 (516 Vermont Street) and improving the alley from the east side of Parcel 23-1-0155-000-00 west to North 5th Street.

WHEREAS, the CITY is desirous of said improvement in that same will be of immediate benefit to CITY residents and be permanent in nature;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The COUNTY agrees to make the surveys, obtain all necessary rights of way, prepare plans and specifications, receive bids and award the contract, furnish engineering inspection during construction and cause the improvement to be built in accordance with the plans, specifications and contract.

2. The COUNTY agrees to pay for all construction and engineering costs subject to reimbursement by the CITY as hereinafter stipulated.

3. Design engineering for the alley from east side of Parcel 23-1-0155-000-00 to North 5th Street shall be conducted by the CITY.

4. It is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the estimated cost and cost proration for this improvement is as follows:

Participation and reimbursement shall be predicated by the percentages shown above for the specified work. Costs shall be determined by bid prices for each portion of work as identified above.

5. The COUNTY and CITY will jointly review and approve the plans and specifications prior to letting.

6. The CITY agrees to provide written approval of that portion of the plans and specifications relative to the CITY's obligations described herein, prior to the COUNTY's advertising for the afore described proposed improvement, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit A.

7. The COUNTY agrees to advertise, receive bids, award, and sign the contract for project construction with concurrence of the CITY.

8. The COUNTY agrees to have their engineering representatives inspect the project work and certify that all is reasonably completed in accordance with the Specifications. Written certification shall be included with the final request for payment.

9. The COUNTY will submit periodic invoices to the CITY for all work completed for reimbursement. The invoice shall include support documentation such as a pay estimate for the contractor.

10. Upon the completion of the contract work but prior to the final payment to the contractor, the COUNTY will schedule a final field inspection. The final inspection shall be at a time mutually agreed upon by the COUNTY and the CITY.



Real Estate License Agreement City of Quincy and Adams County 2023

REAL ESTATE LICENSE AGREEMENT

This Real Estate License Agreement (this "Agreement") is made effective as of February 16, 2023, between City of Quincy, an Illinois Municipal Corporation (hereafter referred to as "City") and the County of Adams, Illinois (hereafter referred to as "County"). In the Agreement, City is granting the right to use the licensed property (defined below) and the County is receiving the right to use the licensed property.

The parties agree as follows:

GRANT OF LICENSE. The City has jurisdiction over the north-south alley between Vermont and Hampshire and 5th to 6th Streets (Jessamine Alley). Adams County owns a parking lot adjacent to the North-South alley off Vermont St. As of the execution date of this Agreement, a portion of the alley is leased by City to the County for expansion and improvement of the employee parking lot. This Agreement grants the County exclusive license to install improvements and maintain the parking lot and sidewalk shown on Exhibit "A", (the "Licensed Property"). The County may not use the Licensed Property for any other purpose or business without obtaining City's prior written consent.

LICENSEE RESPONSIBILITIES.

Design, installation and maintenance of the parking lot and adjacent 6 foot sidewalk.
Loading and Unloading space located per Exhibit A identified with proper signage.
Petitioner is responsible any damages to City infrastructure.
City Engineer to approve parking lot and sidewalk improvement plans prior to construction.

PAYMENT OF LICENSE FEE. The County will pay the City a one-time license fee of one dollar (\$1.00). The license fee shall be paid at the timing of the signing of this Agreement.

MODIFICATIONS. Unless the prior written approval of the City is obtained, the County shall not change modify or change the License Property in any manner.

DEFAULTS. If the County fails to abide by the obligations of this Agreement, the City shall have the option to cancel this Agreement by providing written notice to the County.

IDEMNITY REGARDING USE OF PROPERTY. To the extent permitted by law, Licensee agrees to Indemnify, hold harmless, and defend Licensor from and against any and all losses, claims, liabilities, and expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, if any, which Licensor suffers or incurs in connection with Licensee's possession, use or misuse of the Licensed Property.

TRANSFER OF RIGHTS. This Agreement shall be binding on any successor of the parties. Neither party shall have the right to assign its interests in this Agreement to any other party, unless the prior written consent of the other party is obtained.

TERMINATION. This agreement may be terminated by either party by providing 30 days written notice to the other party. This Agreement shall terminate automatically on January 1, 2100. On or before the termination date, Licensee shall remove all of Licensee's personal property from the Licensed Property and shall surrender possession of the Licensed Property to Licensor in good order and repair to the satisfaction of Licensor.

ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties and there are no other promises or conditions in any other agreement whether oral or written. This Agreement supersedes any prior written or oral agreements between the parties.

AMENDMENT. This Agreement may be modified or amended if the amendment is made in writing and is signed by both parties.

SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and enforceable. If a court finds that any provision of this Agreement is invalid or unenforceable; but that by limiting such provision it would become valid or enforceable, then such provision shall be deemed to be written, constructed, and enforced as so limited.

WAVIER OF CONTRACTUAL RIGHT. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a wavier or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce and compel strict compliance with every provision of this Agreement.

APPLICABLE LAW. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois. dated this 16th day of February 2023.

AMEREN ILLINOIS OFFERS THE RIGHT TREE, RIGHT PLACE GRANT PROGRAM TO PROMOTE A PARTNERSHIP APPROACH TO VEGETATION MANAGEMENT WITH THE MUNICIPALITIES WE SERVE.

As part of this program, we work with municipal leaders to identify trees which may be better suited for removal rather than continual trimming. This grant program provides municipalities with funds to replace removed trees or promote the principles of the Arbor Day Foundation's Tree City USA Program. Communities will be awarded \$125 for each eligible removed tree.

1. Work with your Ameren Illinois Forestry Supervisor to identify trees eligible for removal by Ameren Illinois.

WHAT IS A “HAZARD TREE?”

Ameren Illinois employs vegetation management techniques which are designed to promote tree health and protect our electric delivery system. Part of our vegetation management plan includes working with municipalities to identify hazard trees which are candidates for removal. A hazard tree is a dead, dying or otherwise unstable tree that is threatening the power lines and must be addressed on a case-by-case basis. This includes trees that are well below the power lines, yet could cause future interference as they grow. If trimmed away from the power lines, these trees will still need continual maintenance trimming every few years. These trees are targets for removal.

VEGETATION MANAGEMENT BASICS

1. Trees growing up toward the power lines are targets for removal. Even trees that are well below the power lines should be removed to prevent future interference. Stumps will not be ground out.
2. We will coordinate tree removal with the city.
3. City is responsible for removal of debris.

GRANT PROGRAM BASICS

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1. Only trees growing in public rights-of-way and having the potential to interfere with overhead lines are eligible for the grant program.
2. Trees must be identified before removal and approved as eligible by your local Ameren Illinois Forestry Supervisor.
3. \$125 will be awarded for each eligible tree removed, up to \$2,500.
4. Communities may use the funds in a manner consistent with the Right Tree, Right Place principles. Some examples include:
 - » Planting new trees outside of the right-of-way
 - » Planting approved replacement trees inside the right of way (work with your Ameren Illinois Forestry Supervisor)
 - » Developing a community-wide tree management plan
 - » Maintenance of existing trees
 - » Obtaining Tree City USA certification
5. Communities may apply more than once per year, but the maximum annual grant award will be \$2,500.
6. Only government entities (villages, towns, townships, and counties) are eligible to apply.
7. Community members must receive electric delivery service from Ameren Illinois.

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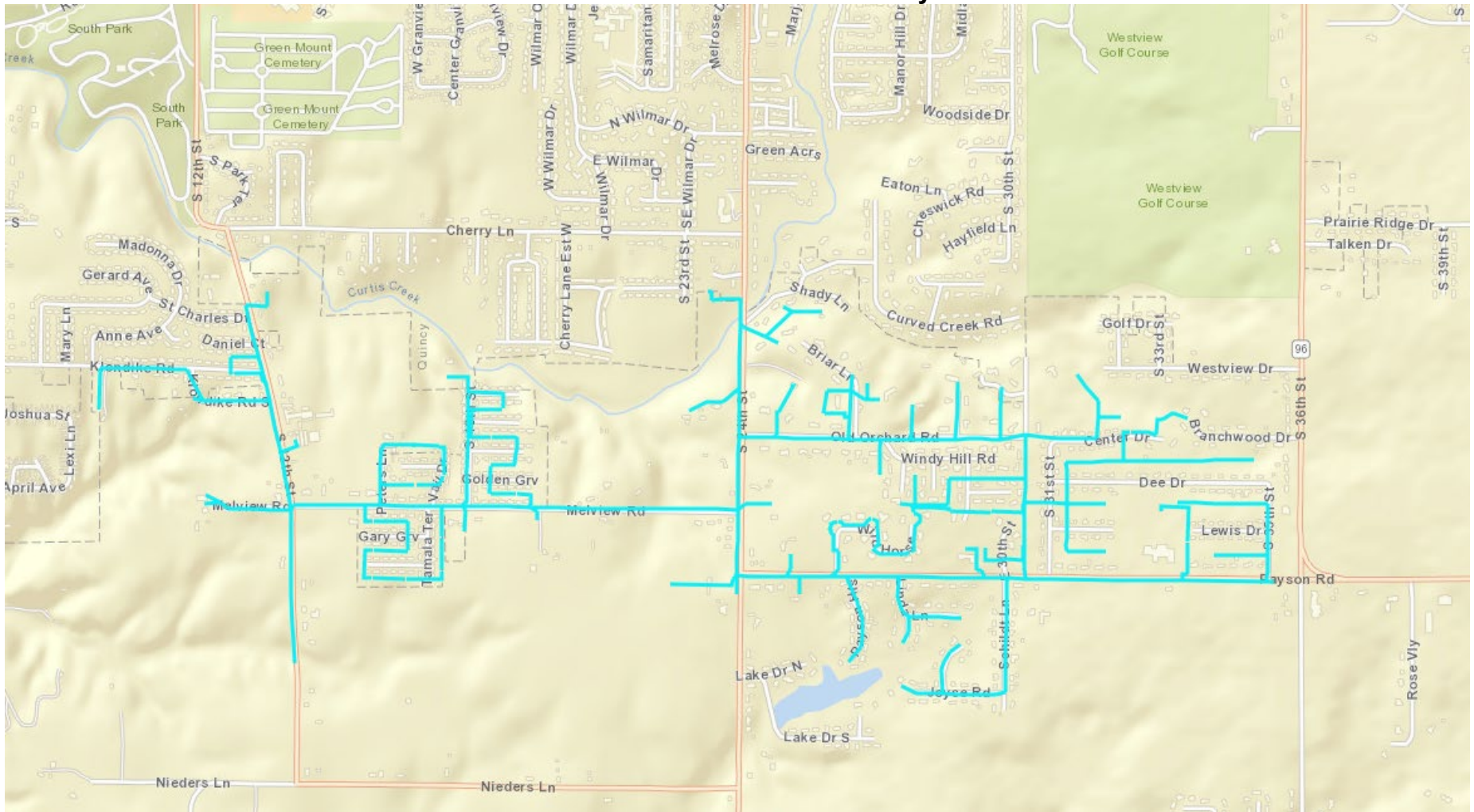

Pipeline Integrity Management Plan

Pipeline integrity management is a process for assessing and mitigating pipeline risks in an effort to reduce both the likelihood and consequences of incidents.

The Pipeline Safety Improvement Act of 2002 is a federally mandated legislation that addresses risk analysis and integrity management programs for pipeline operators. It also directs the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) to adopt regulations relating to integrity management. DOT finalized these regulations on December 17, 2004. Natural gas transmission pipeline operators were then required to begin conducting assessment by June 17, 2004, have a management program in place by December 17, 2004, and to complete baseline assessments of pipe in high consequence areas by 2012. We have implemented an integrity management program for pipelines in the company's high consequence areas according to the DOT regulations. It is a systematic and comprehensive process designed to provide information to effectively allocate resources to appropriate prevention, detection and mitigation activities. The program builds on the existing foundation of pipeline safety regulations covering design, construction, testing, operation and maintenance that has been in place for many years.

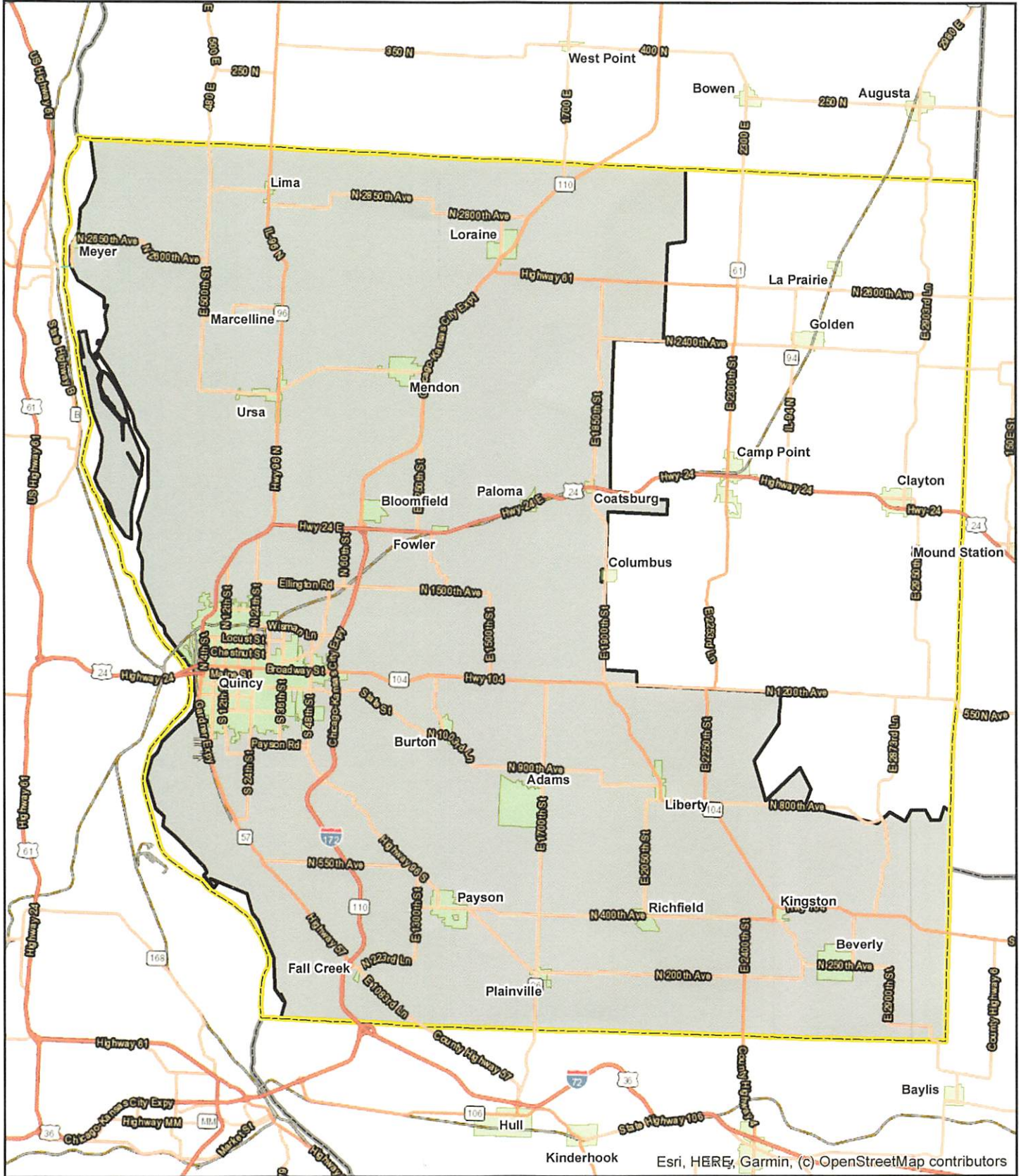
These are the basic steps in the integrity management process.

- **High Consequence Area (HCA) Identification** – Locations along the Pipeline System that meet the criteria for High Consequence Areas are identified. Generally, these are high population density areas or difficult to evacuate facilities, such as hospitals, prisons or schools, and locations where people congregate, such as churches, office buildings or playgrounds.
- **Threat identification and risk assessment** – Information about the pipeline segments are evaluated to identify the threats of concerns to the pipe and to assess risk.
- **Risk Analysis** – a systematic process in which potential hazards from facility operation are identified, and the likelihood and consequences of potential adverse events are estimated. Each pipeline segment is given a numerical score based on the estimated risk.
- **Regulatory Requirements** – The 107th Congress approved bill H.R. 3607 known as the "Pipeline Safety Improvement Act of 2002" on December 17, 2002. Upon becoming a law, it became Public Law 107-355 which can be found at www.gpo.gov. The Pipeline Safety Improvement Act of 2002 introduces several new requirements for Pipeline Operators including those specifically addressing Pipeline Integrity Management. Section 14 of the Act titled "Risk Analysis and Integrity Management Programs for Gas Pipelines" mandates several new pipeline integrity related requirements.
- **Baseline assessment plan** – A schedule for performing pipe integrity assessments over the 10-year baseline period is developed. Risk assessment results are used to prioritize the projects. The highest risk 50 percent was required to be assessed by December 17, 2007 and the other 50 percent by December 17, 2012. The method of integrity assessment is also selected for each segment and becomes part of the plan along with the schedule. More than one method may be required depending on the threats identified.
- **Integrity assessment** – The pipe segments are assessed according to the schedule and methods identified in the Baseline Assessment Plan. There are three primary assessment methods:
 - 1) Inline inspection – an inspection tool, often called a "smart pig," is run through the pipeline to evaluate the pipe's condition.
 - 2) Pressure test – the pipe is pressured to at least one and one-half its normal operating limit to test the strength of the pipe. Water is usually used to pressure the pipe during the test.
 - 3) Direct Assessment – a structured, multistep evaluation is conducted to identify potential problem areas.

Every day, natural gas is safely and efficiently delivered to millions of businesses and homes in the United States through more than 2 million miles of underground pipeline.

Nicor Gas operates, secures and maintains the pipeline in our service territory. With safety being our highest priority, we adhere to federal, state and local pipeline safety regulations by performing extensive quality control checks, educate the public on natural gas pipeline leak recognition and damage prevention and work closely with emergency and public officials to develop emergency response plans:

How to recognize a pipeline leak

- **LOOK** for blowing dirt, discolored vegetation or continued bubbling of standing water.
- **LISTEN** for a hissing or roaring noise near a natural gas appliance or line.
- **SMELL** for the distinctive, rotten-egg odor associated with natural gas. Natural gas is colorless and odorless, so we add a chemical odorant called mercaptan for easy detection of a suspected natural gas leak. This odorant has a distinctive "rotten egg" type odor. You should act any time you detect even a small amount of this odor in the air. Be aware that "odorant fade," while uncommon, can occur. Odorant fade occurs when a physical or chemical process causes the level of odorant in the gas to be reduced. This can happen in both existing gas pipe and new installations.

Note: Be aware that "odorant fade," while uncommon, can occur. Odorant fade occurs when a physical or chemical process causes the level of odorant in the gas to be reduced. This can happen in both existing gas pipe and new installations. Be aware that some individuals may not be able to detect the smell of the natural gas odorant because they have a diminished sense of smell, because the scent is being masked by other odors in the area or because the odorant has diminished so that it is not detectable. Some gas lines, due to their unique function, may not have odor at all.

Help keep everyone safe during a natural gas emergency

Even though natural gas pipeline incidents are uncommon, it is still important to be prepared by knowing the signs of a potential problem.

You should take the following action any time you detect any of the signs of a pipeline leak:

- **DO NOT** try to identify the source to stop the leak yourself.
- **AVOID** using any sources of ignition, such as cell phones, cigarettes, matches, flashlights, electronic devices, motorized vehicles, light switches or landlines, as natural gas can ignite from a spark or open flame, possibly causing a fire or explosion. Natural gas is non-toxic, lighter than air and displaces oxygen. In severe cases, if not used properly, natural gas can also lead to asphyxiation.
- **CALL** Nicor Gas immediately at our 24-hour emergency response line at **888.Nicor4U (642.6748)** with the location and type of emergency.
- **SECURE** the area by establishing a safety zone around the incident and control access. You may need to reroute traffic and evacuate area homes and businesses.

Prevention – the best defense against leaks

Emergency officials and first responders do their part daily to prevent natural gas leaks by keeping the following safety tips in mind:

- Understand that natural gas is lighter than air and displaces oxygen. Although natural gas is non-toxic, in extreme cases of oxygen displacement, it may lead to asphyxiation. Natural gas has a risk of ignition near a spark or open flame.
- Know where the pipelines are in your jurisdiction. If you notice any missing or damaged pipeline markers, contact Nicor Gas at **888.Nicor4U (642.6748)** so they can be replaced.

- Illinois law requires all underground utilities be marked before any type of digging or excavation. Be on the lookout for any suspicious activity or unauthorized digging. If the excavator has not notified the state of their intent to dig, they must stop all activity immediately. The excavator is required to present a valid dig ticket number when requested by first responders. Also, no one, including homeowners, should be digging, ditching, drilling, leveling or plowing without having first contacted our state's One-Call number (**811**) to locate underground utilities.


